# Safety Tips

## Safety tips you should always remember



Always **look right, then left, and right again** before crossing the road. Make sure there are no vehicles coming from either direction.



Always **use zebra crossings**, pedestrian bridges, or traffic lights to cross the road. These are the safest places to cross.



**Never run into the road**, even if you are in a hurry. Walk quickly but carefully.



Always **walk on the sidewalk**. If there is no sidewalk, walk facing traffic so you can see oncoming vehicles.



Always **pay attention** to your surroundings. Avoid using phones or wearing headphones while walking near or crossing roads.




**Do not play near roads** or in parking lots. Always stay in designated play areas.



Always **hold an adult's hand** when crossing the road or walking near traffic.
